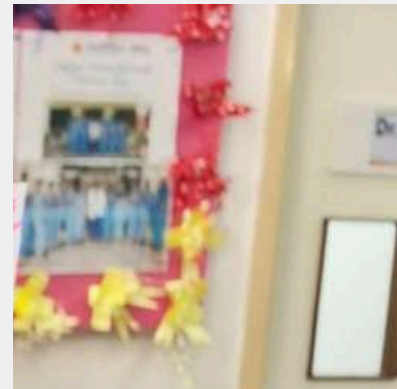
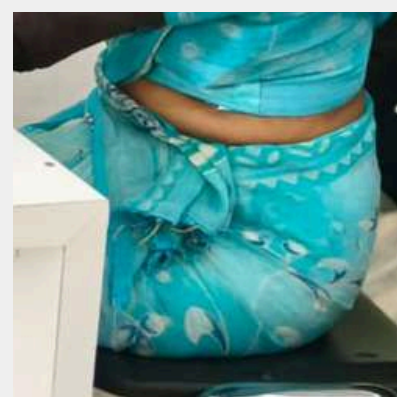

A Clinic on Wheels: Expanding Access Through the Tata MD Telemedicine Van



Swaasthya Hospital welcomed a new **Telemedicine Van**, generously donated by **Tata MD**, and inaugurated by **Beloved Sri M, CEO & MD TataMD Mr. Girish Krishnamurthy** and **Swaasthya Hospitals's Medical Director Dr. N. K. Venkataramana**. The addition brings renewed capability to Swaasthya's outreach services, strengthening its mission to take quality healthcare closer to rural communities.

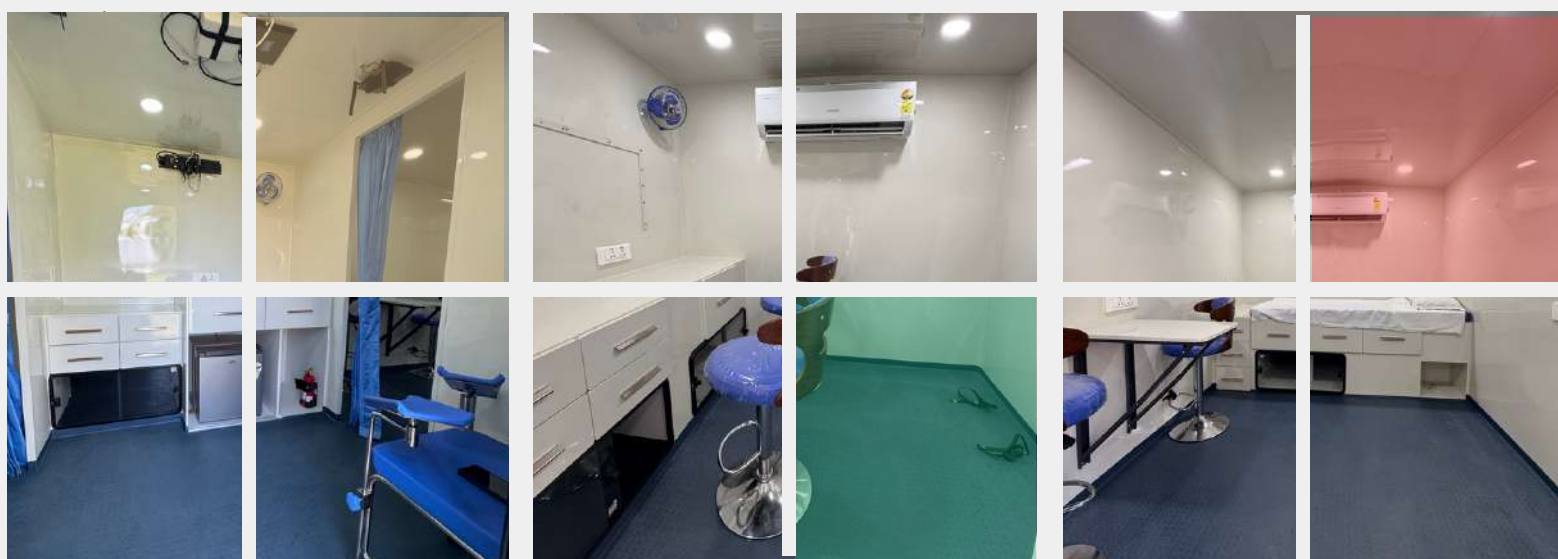
Features of the Telemedicine Van:

- Three functional sections for efficient use of space:
 - **Health screening area** for basic tests and blood sample collection.
 - **Teleconsultation area** equipped with a seating, and a Wi-Fi setup for real-time video consultations with specialists at Swaasthya Hospital.
 - **Examination area** with a check-up bed for physical assessments and private consultations.

- **Provisioned for diagnostics and future upgrades:** designed to integrate essential diagnostic devices such as BP monitors, glucometers, pulse oximeters, ECGs, and portable imaging units (ultrasound/X-ray) as needed.
- **Power and connectivity:** equipped with a hybrid power system — diesel generator, direct AC/DC supply, and a battery-operated backup. The battery system supports operations for up to six hours, ensuring uninterrupted teleconsultations and diagnostic services even in remote areas without power access.

Serving the Annamaya District, where nearly 77% of the population lives in rural areas, the van will play a key role in providing accessible, specialist-led healthcare without the burden of long-distance travel.

Through this initiative, Swaasthya Hospital's Outreach Division continues its focused effort to make quality medical care more inclusive — bridging the gap between rural communities and advanced healthcare facilities.



Advancing Diagnostics and Preventive Care



Swaasthya Hospitals is proud to introduce **nine new health screening packages** designed to meet the needs of all age groups and health conditions. Offered at rates well below market prices, these packages make preventive care and early detection both reliable and affordable, enabling more people in the community to access timely health assessments.

This initiative is supported by our fully in-house laboratory, established in partnership with Neuberg Anand Diagnostics. Upgrades such as equipment calibration, sample barcoding, internal quality control, and integration with the hospital management system ensure that every test meets the highest standards of accuracy.

To enhance efficiency and precision, a **fully automated Autochem Xpert Biochemistry Analyzer**, donated by Dedalus and inaugurated by **Dr. V. Ravi, Head of Research & Development, Tata MD**, has been commissioned. This advanced system delivers faster, highly accurate results while minimizing human error, supporting both inpatient and outpatient care.

Radiology services have likewise been strengthened with the **appointment of a full-time radiologist**, expanding access to CT scans, digital X-rays, and ultrasound services.

Together, these developments reinforce Swaasthya's commitment to providing affordable, high-quality, and comprehensive healthcare to the community.



Infrastructure Upgrade: Professional Washer & Dryer Installed

Maintaining hygiene is integral to quality healthcare. To strengthen this, a professional-grade washer and dryer were recently installed at the hospital, generously gifted by **UniCare Emergency Equipment Pvt. Ltd.** and **Caliber Technologies**.

The new system was inaugurated by **Mr. Girish Krishnamurthy, MD & CEO, Tata MD,** and **Dr. N. K. Venkataramana, Medical Director, Swaasthya Hospitals.**

Built for high-volume, continuous use, the system ensures a quicker turnaround of hospital linens, staff uniforms, and patient bedding — reducing downtime and reinforcing infection control. With superior sanitizing cycles and improved energy efficiency, it enables safe, consistent, and sustainable laundry operations, underscoring our commitment to the highest standards of cleanliness and patient care.

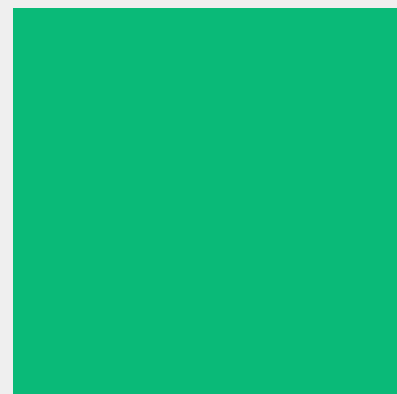
Education Starts Young: School Health Initiatives

Health camps at **Nav Chaitanya Bharthi School** during parent-teacher meetings, providing child health assessments and parental awareness. Families received practical advice on nutrition, hygiene, and preventive care — empowering them to nurture lifelong habits of wellness

Reaching the Unreached: Village Health Camps

Outreach camps were held in **Pottemvaripalle (Sadum Mandal), Ponnetipalayam (Madanapalle Mandal), and Saidapeta (Madanapalle Town)** — bringing essential healthcare directly to underserved communities.

In these areas, where daily survival often takes precedence over health, many residents delay seeking care until illness becomes critical. By taking medical services to their doorsteps, Swaasthya is breaking barriers, promoting early diagnosis, and fostering a culture of health awareness and prevention.



Specialized Care Running Like Clockwork

In-house specialty camps continued seamlessly, including **fortnightly Neuro Camps** and **monthly Dental Camps**. These regular programs ensure continuity of advanced, dependable care for patients who rely on specialized services.

Serving Those Who Serve: Court House Camp

At the **Court House in Madanapalle Town**, we focused on people who serve our communities daily—court staff, legal professionals, and the general public. This allowed us to reach working professionals who often neglect their health due to demanding schedules, reinforcing that healthcare should be convenient and accessible to everyone.

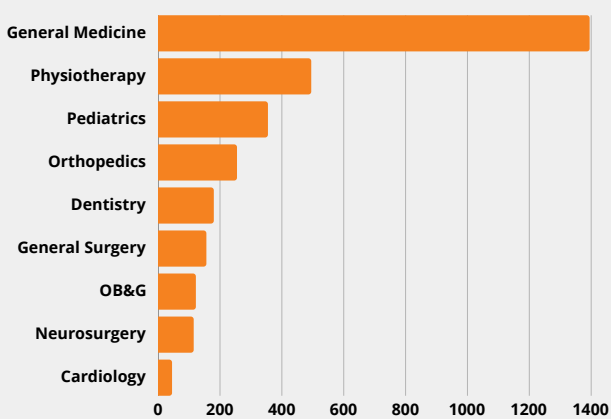

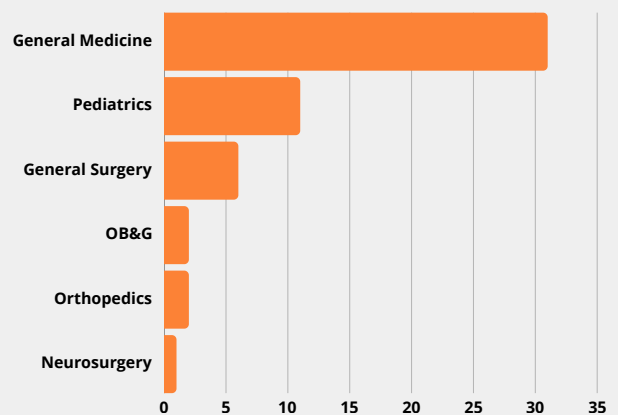

Case Highlights

Timely ICU Care for Stroke in a Young Father

Patient: 41-year-old male

Diagnosis: Acute Ischemic Stroke, Newly Diagnosed Hypertension & Diabetes

A 41-year-old man arrived with sudden right-sided weakness and was diagnosed with an acute ischemic stroke. He was admitted to the ICU for continuous neurological and hemodynamic monitoring. Our team provided stroke protocol-based treatment, blood pressure control, and diabetes management, along with supportive care. With early intervention and vigilant observation, his strength gradually returned. He was discharged in stable condition with a plan for ongoing risk-factor management.

Why it matters: ICU monitoring and early treatment prevented further stroke complications and supported a young patient's recovery.

ICU Stabilization After Brain Aneurysm Surgery

Patient: 59-year-old female

Diagnosis: Post-Surgical Hypotension with History of Ruptured Aneurysm (post-clipping)

A 59-year-old woman underwent surgery for a ruptured brain aneurysm. During her recovery, she developed sudden dizziness and low blood pressure — a serious complication in a high-risk patient.

She was admitted to Swaasthya Hospital's ICU, where advanced monitoring allowed continuous observation of her blood pressure and neurological status. She received fluids, supportive medications, and round-the-clock care. With timely intervention, her condition stabilized, and she was safely discharged with clear follow-up instructions.

Why it matters: In the critical days following brain surgery, the ICU's skilled team and modern monitoring ensured a safe recovery, preventing a potentially minor complication from escalating into a life-threatening situation.

Case Highlights

NICU Saves a Newborn from Sepsis

Patient: Term male newborn

Diagnosis: Neonatal Sepsis with Feeding Intolerance

A full-term baby was delivered safely by Caesarean section, cried immediately at birth, and had good APGAR scores. He was initially kept with his mother for routine care and breastfeeding. The mother, however, had a fever around the time of delivery and was treated appropriately.

For the first several hours, the baby appeared well. At 16 hours of life, he suddenly developed poor activity, weak feeding, and abdominal distension — early signs of infection that can manifest after birth. He was promptly admitted to the NICU, where IV fluids, antibiotics, and supportive care were initiated. Continuous monitoring and investigations guided the treatment.

By 48 hours, his condition improved, feeding tolerance returned, and activity levels picked up. Within 72 hours, he was well enough to room-in with his mother and continue exclusive breastfeeding. He was later discharged in stable condition with follow-up instructions.

Why it matters: Neonatal infections can appear suddenly after birth. Vigilant observation and rapid NICU intervention ensured a safe recovery, allowing both mother and baby to go home together in good health.

My name is Vijaya. My daughter Tejaswini had been suffering from a high fever for three days, which suddenly led to a fall and seizures. She was in a very critical condition.

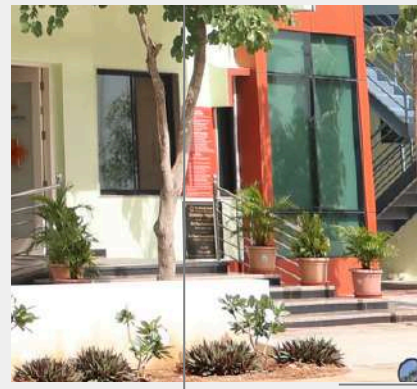
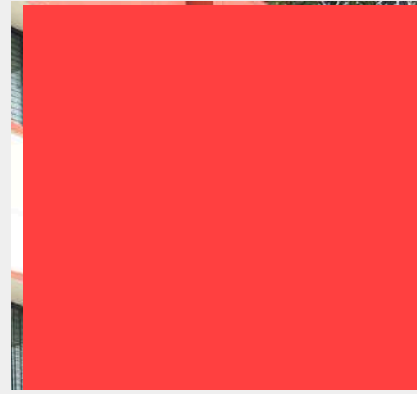

Case Summary

A 23-year-old woman was diagnosed with acute meningoencephalitis due to cryptococcal meningitis with septic shock. Immediate emergency stabilization, intensive ICU care, and antifungal therapy were initiated. With vigilant monitoring and coordinated multidisciplinary management, she made a steady recovery and was discharged in stable condition in 3 weeks.
