Executive Summary

- Laboratory services strengthened:** In partnership with Neuberger Anand Diagnostics, Swaasthya launched fully in-house lab services, introducing calibration, barcoding, quality controls, and HMS integration to ensure accuracy and patient safety.
- Mega Health Camp:** Over 950 patients received free consultations, medicines, diagnostics, and scans across nine specialties, in collaboration with Brains and Vydehi Hospitals and supported by Mr. Nawaz Basha.
- Ganesh Chaturthi observance:** For the first time, staff and management came together to celebrate the festival on a grand scale—with rituals, pujas, shared meals, and Annadanam—fostering togetherness and a spirit of service.
- Patient stories and case highlights:** From stabilizing a critically ill woman denied admission elsewhere to enabling recovery in complex orthopedic and stroke cases, timely and compassionate multidisciplinary care defined this month.

Elevating Standards in Patient-Centered Diagnostics

At Swaasthya Hospital, providing accurate and reliable diagnostic reports has always been a priority. To strengthen this commitment, we partnered with Neuberger Anand Diagnostics, Bangalore, a trusted reference laboratory known for quality and excellence. Through this partnership, our diagnostic services are now offered through a fully in-house laboratory.

As part of the collaboration, our laboratory team visited Neuberger's facility, gaining exposure to the latest practices in laboratory operations, quality management systems, and staff training. The upgraded lab functions at Swaasthya began in the first week of August.

Key initiatives include:

- Machine calibration: all equipment has been re-calibrated to ensure precision and consistency in test results.
- Pre-analytic: barcoding for patient samples is being introduced to improve identification accuracy and reduce errors.
- Analytic: internal quality controls have been reinforced, supported by structured training sessions for technicians.
- Post-analytic: as part of the shift to a fully in-house lab, HMS integration is underway to reduce manual handling and errors.

Within a month of these upgrades, the Neuberger team visited to review progress and provide further recommendations. This ongoing partnership will continue to guide training, equipping, and strengthening our laboratory services.

This initiative reflects Swaasthya Hospital's dedication to continuous improvement, patient safety, and dependable diagnostics — ensuring that patients and clinicians can place complete trust in every report generated at our facility.

Mega Health Camp – August 2, 2025

On August 2, 2025, Swaasthya Hospitals in partnership with Brains Hospital and Vydehi Hospital, Bengaluru, organized a large-scale Mega Health Camp with the generous support of Mr. Nawaz Basha, former MLA of Madanapalle.

The camp provided free consultations, diagnostic services, and medicines to about 950 patients. A strong team of specialists in Cardiology, ENT, OBG, Pediatrics, Surgery, Orthopedics, Dentistry, Physiotherapy, and General Medicine worked tirelessly to serve the community.

Though scheduled to start at 9:00 AM, patients began arriving as early as 8:00 AM. Registrations, vital checks, and patient flow were managed seamlessly, even as the overwhelming response continued late into the evening. To ensure no one was left behind, the camp was extended into the following day, accommodating remaining 100 patients with full access to medicines, scans, and lab tests at no cost.

Sri M personally visited the camp, interacting with patients and medical teams, and overseeing arrangements. Refreshments were served reinforcing the spirit of care and hospitality.

Behind the scenes, dedicated volunteers, hospital staff, and students from the Satsang Skill Development Center (SSDC) played a pivotal role—guiding patients, minimizing wait times, and ensuring smooth coordination across all departments.

Swaasthya Hospitals extends its heartfelt gratitude to the doctors from Brains and Vydehi Hospitals for their compassionate care, to Mr. Nawaz Basha and his team for ground-level support, to the SSDC students for their tireless efforts, and to Ashram members and Swaasthya staff for leading this initiative with dedication.

Critical Diabetic Emergency: A Life-Saving Recovery Story

Husband's Testimonial

My wife was feeling breathless. We are from Punganoor, and from 11:00 PM till 8:30 AM, we went to several hospitals, but none admitted her because the deposit they demanded was far more than we could arrange. During this time, her condition worsened, and she slipped into a comatose state, which I didn't realize as I was focused on driving her.

We came to Swaasthya Hospital around 8:30 AM. She cleaned her up, and took her into Emergency, personally lifted her from our car, dialed her immediately and began treatment. It took 2-3 hours to bring her condition under control. Even ID proof was requested only after she was stable. For the last three days, I have been here continuously, and every doctor and nurse has not only cared for my wife but also patiently answered my questions and reassured me. When I fell asleep, the nurses themselves would quietly get the necessary items instead of disturbing me.

Patient's Words

I am thankful to God and to the Swaasthya team. On my third day in the ICU, I am off the ventilator, eating again, and feeling stronger.

A 25-year-old woman with Type 1 Diabetes Mellitus arrived in comatose with Diabetic Ketoacidosis (DKA) complicated by septic shock and aspiration pneumonia. She received immediate intensive care, including IV fluids, insulin infusion, and ICU-level multidisciplinary management. Over several days, she stabilized, regained consciousness, was weaned off the ventilator, and resumed oral feeding. With improving infection markers, she was discharged on day five in stable condition, with follow-up for diabetes.

Case Highlights

Timely Stroke Management Prevents Long-Term Disability

Patient: 63-year-old female
Diagnosis: Right Patella Fracture
Associated Conditions: Left Knee Osteoarthritis, Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus, Hypertension, Parkinsonism/Myoclonus

A 63-year-old woman with a knee fracture was admitted to Emergency. Her recovery was challenging due to existing health conditions—arthritis, diabetes, high blood pressure, and Parkinson-like symptoms. She underwent timely surgery to fix the broken knee, with careful handling to reduce trauma and prevent complications. Antibiotics were given to lower infection risk, and her vitals and blood sugar were closely monitored. Early physiotherapy helped her regain strength and movement.

She was discharged in stable condition with a clear rehabilitation plan.

Why it matters: This case highlights how skilled surgery, vigilant care, and teamwork can help even high-risk patients regain mobility and independence.

Timely Stroke Management Prevents Long-Term Disability

Patient: 60-year old male
Diagnosis: Ischemic Stroke (CVA)
Associated Conditions: Hypertension, Diabetes Mellitus (controlled)

A patient was brought to the Emergency Department with sudden left-sided weakness and neurological deficits. Imaging confirmed a stroke in a part of the right side of the brain. Immediate neuro-assessment and stroke protocol-based treatment were initiated, including medications, IV fluids, and close monitoring of vitals and comorbidities. Early bedside physiotherapy supported neurological recovery. Coordinated care from neurology, physiotherapy, and critical care teams ensured steady improvement. Within days, symptoms reduced significantly, and he was discharged in stable condition with a structured plan for medication, physiotherapy, and follow-up.

Why it matters: This case highlights the importance of rapid stroke response, protocol-based treatment, and coordinated multidisciplinary care in reducing disability and improving outcomes.

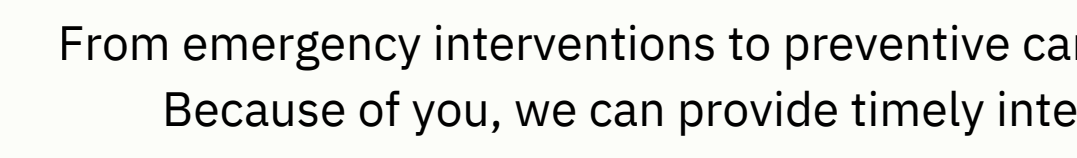
